#### JUROR'S STATEMENT

There is an immediacy to craft, an emotionality in objects made with materials that are both tactile and familiar. With their functional roots, these artful expressions often conjure associations to items that sustain us throughout our lives. One might even say the sharing of space with craft evokes feelings like no other medium can, whether admiration of an artist's handwork, nostalgia for one's past, or resolve to affect social change in our communities.

In jurying the 43rd Annual Contemporary Craft exhibition, I was impressed by the skills and talents of not only those I selected but of all the artists who submitted work for consideration. Based on the entries, it's clear that contemporary craft has expanded beyond the traditional and into ingenious territories: experimental processes and material innovations; social change through making; explorations of identity and culture, to name just a few. As the contemporary craft field continues to evolve, the exhibiting artists in this exhibition appear to be fully embracing this creative groundswell.

As is always the case with a digital review, I longed to experience the works in person, to see them as they are meant to be viewed and in the context of the area in which they were created. I was pleased to encounter the objects with a strong sense of place, those that reflected the vibrant colors, textures, and natural elements of the Southwestern United States. I felt nearly transported from New England to that region, and I thank the artists for allowing me to experience it through their eyes and hands.

A big thanks to Mesa Contemporary Arts Museum for the opportunity to partner in this endeavor and to become acquainted with the organization. I am further grateful to all the artists for the honor of learning about their practices. The objects—functional, sculptural, and those in between—signal the continued beauty of craft and a creative future we have yet to imagine.
















